Assessment and reporting	Relief teacher marks the work in class (as required) and provides feedback to students and the class teacher (as required)	Class and specialist teachers assess work of children at school Class teacher determines work to be submitted to Connect (task and age dependent) by the children learning at home Children who have attended school for 50% or more of the term will be graded on their learning. This will be reflected on their end of semester school report.	Class teacher determines work to be submitted to Connect (task and age dependent)	Parents will be expected to assess their own child's work. Children who have attended school for 50% or more of the term will be graded on their learning by their class teacher and specialist teachers. This will be reflected on their end of semester school report.
Communication	The class teacher is not expected to communicate during the period at home Parents can contact the Principal with any queries or questions by calling 9264 7600 or email Isobel.Comrie@education.wa.edu.au	Class teachers prepare a brief weekly summary/reflection for children at home. In the case of children in Years 3 and above, this may be written by children at school for children learning at home. In the case of children in Years 3 and below, this may include work produced by children at school for children learning at home. Class and specialist teachers will continue regular communication practices with parents and children	Children and parents are invited to email teacher any comments or questions each day. Class teachers prepare a weekly summary/reflection of the week's learning at home. This is emailed to children and parents on Connect on the 5 th day of learning at home. The reflection/summary may include clarification of tasks, concepts, helpful tips, interesting findings, motivational tips, photos of work and good news stories.
